History

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy was originally founded in 2007 by Matthew J. Brownstein as the Florida Institute of Hypnotherapy in Gainesville, Florida. The school relocated to Tampa, Florida in 2011. Matthew began his hypnotherapy career in 1997 and after ten years of successful practice he opened the Institute with a first class of 25 students through the support of his mentor Mr. Gil Boyne. The corporate name changed from Anahat Meditation Center to Anahat Education Group in 2012 to better reflect the mission of the corporation itself. Around the same time, Anahat Education Group

relocated to One Tampa City Center and operated on the 34th floor of a downtown Tampa skyscraper, yet for the ease of student accessibility, the school relocated to 2901 West Busch Blvd. #806 and then found its way to 2805 West Busch Blvd. #103, Tampa, Florida which proved to be an ideal space for the overall student experience. In 2020, the Institute gained Commission for Independent Education approval to offer all programs online as well as in the previous hybrid format. In 2025, due to an increased demand for our online training, the Institute closed its Tampa location and moved the primary license to our Maitland, Florida location. Trainings now occur online, and practicum hours can be done online or in Maitland.

Facilities and Equipment

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy operates out of a 1,314 sq. ft. space, which is located at 540 East Horatio Avenue, Suite #200, Maitland, Florida, 32751. The Institute has one large classroom, three offices, a kitchenette, a waiting area, and a reference library. The classroom is well lit and contains teaching aids including audio/visual equipment. Note: The Institute's Maitland facility has certain physical accessibility limitations and may not be able to accommodate all mobility-related needs at the physical location. The Institute's programs are also available through online distance education, including supervised practicum training. Students who require an accommodation are encouraged to contact the Institute so that available options and reasonable accommodations can be discussed.

Clinical Externship Location

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy is licensed by the Florida Department of Education's Commission for Independent Education to offer distance learning in Hypnotherapy through our Maitland, Florida location and online.

As part of the program, students are required to complete practicum hours. These take place either online, at our Maitland campus, or at approved Clinical Externship Locations—functioning hypnotherapy clinics where qualified directors, instructors, supervisors, and examiners oversee hands-on training.

Please note that students attending in-person may be required to travel up to 300 miles for practicum training, depending on the site selected or available. All travel costs and arrangements are the responsibility of the student.

Family Educational Rights and Policy

Pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, a student or former student has the right to inspect their educational record maintained by the school. The Institute reserves the right to change courses of study, course content, fees, program requirements, class schedules, and the academic calendar, or to make other changes deemed necessary or desirable, giving advance notice of the change whenever possible. Students currently enrolled will not be affected by tuition increases.

Non-Discrimination Policy

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy admits qualified students without regard to their race, religion, color, age, sex, sexual orientation, national or ethnic origin, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law to the rights and privileges, programs, and other activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school.

Financial Obligations

Tuition must be paid on time according to the terms on the Enrollment Agreement. These terms include the following:

- A clock hour is a 60-minute period containing a minimum of 50 minutes of instruction. Tuition is \$19.50 per clock hour.
- Required Textbooks: Up to \$234.65, plus applicable tax, for required textbooks. Textbook prices may vary slightly. Optional books are additional.

Optional expenses:

- Additional mentoring/tutoring at \$75/hour.
- Graduation dinner no more than \$50 per attendee.
- To reserve a seat in the class, students must submit a minimum \$300 deposit, plus any additional tuition payment and applicable tax. Of the initial deposit, \$100 is designated as the registration fee and becomes non-refundable after the three-business-day cancellation period described in the Refund Policy. The remainder of the deposit is applied toward tuition. Payment may be made by cash, check, cashier's check, or major credit card.
- Private student financing is available to qualified students. Programs may be paid for individually or paid in full in advance.
- The initial fee for registration and certification through the International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists is \$75.00, paid annually, with printed certificates costing \$10 each.
- **Printed Manuals and Practicum Guides**
Being a predominantly online training, we do not provide printed training manuals or practicum guides as part of your tuition. However, some students may prefer to have physical copies for ease of study and note-taking. If you would like to print the materials yourself, the following are approximate costs based on standard black-and-white printing (double-sided, without professional binding, using a typical office supply store or online printer):

Training Manuals (5 volumes, approx. 200 pages each): ~200 pages × 5 manuals = ~1,000 pages total. Printing costs generally range from **\$0.05–\$0.10 per page**, making the total cost about **\$50–\$100** for the full set.

Practicum Exercise Guides (5 volumes, approx. 60 pages each): ~60 pages × 5 guides = ~300 pages total. Estimated cost is **\$15–\$30** for the full set.

Total for All Manuals and Guides: Approximately **\$65–\$130**, depending on the printer you use, paper quality, and whether you choose simple stapling, three-hole punch, or other minimal binding options.

Graduation from the Institute and certification through the International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists (IAIH) do not constitute a state health-care license and do not, by themselves, determine a graduate's lawful scope of practice. Laws governing hypnosis and hypnotherapy vary by jurisdiction and may regulate therapeutic or health-related uses, professional titles, registration, disclosures, advertising, referral or supervision relationships, and other aspects of practice. Students and graduates are responsible for determining and complying with the laws that apply where they practice and, for remote services, where the client is physically located. See Appendix II for a 50-state and District of Columbia educational summary.

In case of extenuating circumstances, the student should consult the Admissions Department.

Hypnosis Law by State

The legal status of hypnosis and hypnotherapy is not uniform throughout the United States. Some jurisdictions have hypnosis-specific registration, exemption, or referral provisions; others regulate hypnosis when it falls within medicine, psychology, counseling, psychotherapy, dentistry, or another licensed profession. The same technique may therefore be lawful for general self-improvement in one context but regulated when used to diagnose, treat, or claim to treat a medical or mental-health condition. Occupational titles may also be regulated separately from the underlying activity.

Appendix II provides an educational summary for all 50 states and the District of Columbia. It is a starting point for independent legal verification, not legal advice or a determination that any particular service or title is lawful. Laws, regulations, board interpretations, and enforcement positions can change. Students and graduates should review current primary governmental sources and consult the appropriate regulator or qualified legal counsel when a scope-of-practice question is unclear.

Reduction of Tuition or Fees

A reduction in tuition, fees, or other charges may be implemented when there are specific criteria for student eligibility and selection procedures precisely disclosed within a policy at the institution. All students within the enrollment period that the reduction is offered must be eligible to apply for this reduction under the same circumstance; however, there shall be no reduction based upon the timing or method of payment. The institution must maintain verifiable records including detailed and complete data when students are granted a bona fide reduction in tuition or fees. This must include copies of all application records, notes of selection committee meetings, and copies of notices to the student who received the reduction. This information is kept on file at the institution for onsite review by the CIE.

The Institute may offer scholarships or other bona fide reductions in tuition or fees when specific eligibility criteria and selection procedures have been established and disclosed in accordance with applicable requirements. Any such award would be based on documented eligibility and approval procedures and would not be based on the timing or method of payment. Currently, the Institute does not offer scholarships or reductions in tuition or fees.

Admissions

Admission Procedures

Persons interested in applying for admission to The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy should contact the Institution's Admissions Office and an Admissions Representative will guide you through the following admission procedures:

- Step One – Be interviewed by an Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy Admissions Representative.
- Step Two – Provide the required deposit.
- Step Three – Complete the Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy's Enrollment Agreement and Employment Attestation.
- Step Four – Complete payment arrangements in accordance with the Enrollment Agreement.

Students who require reasonable accommodations are encouraged to notify the Institute as early as possible so that their individual needs can be evaluated and available accommodations can be discussed. The Institute will consider requests for reasonable accommodations in accordance with applicable law and the requirements of the educational program. Certain physical accessibility limitations may exist at the Maitland facility; when appropriate, online instruction or online supervised practicum may provide an alternative means of participation.

Admission Requirements

All students must be 18 years of age or older, must be financially capable of paying for their own tuition and show a strong desire to become an ethical and certified hypnotherapist according to the standards of the International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists. Credits from other institutions are not transferable towards an education at The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy.

Enrollment Agreement

Students are required to sign an Enrollment Agreement with the Institute as part of the enrollment process. The Enrollment Agreement identifies the program in which the student is enrolling and provides important information regarding tuition and fees, payment arrangements, the class schedule, admission requirements, cancellation and refund policies, graduation requirements, employment assistance, certification requirements, and other student and Institute responsibilities. Students are expected to review the agreement carefully before signing and should ask any questions they may have prior to completing enrollment.

The Enrollment Agreement becomes part of the student's official enrollment record and documents the terms and conditions agreed upon by both the student and the Institute.

Academic Information

Credit for Prior Education

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy does not accept transfer credits from other organizations towards a student's training at the Institute. If a student wishes to transfer credits achieved at The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy to another school, then it is at the sole discretion of that other school whether The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy credits will be accepted. The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy cannot guarantee transferability of credits between schools.

Class Schedule

Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy training consists of three major components, each with its own schedule. These components consist of:

- Online pre-practicum seminar hours with Certified Instructors.
- Interactive distance learning consisting of videos, training manuals, and student resources.
- Supervised practicum hours.

Online Pre-Practicum Seminar Schedule

Students attend live online classes with a Certified Instructor on days and times as posted in the schedule in the Class Schedule section. These classes occur for two to three hours approximately five times every seven weeks.

Interactive Distance Learning

Each week students are required to engage in our interactive learning system where specific videos are viewed in coordination with training manuals and the school's comprehensive online resource library of audio, video, PowerPoint and print media. These hours consist, on average, of approximately 15 clock hours per week.

Supervised Practicum Hours

Approximately once every seven weeks, students are required to attend practicum hours in our Maitland locations or online for direct supervision of hypnotherapy techniques. These hours are from 8:30am to 6:30pm - Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays for Clinical Externship locations and 9:30am to 7:30pm Eastern time – Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays for online. See the school schedule in the Class Schedule section for exact days, dates, and times.

All students are enrolled through the Maitland school location. Approximately 70% of the program consists of interactive distance instruction, and approximately 30% consists of supervised practicum training. Practicum training may be completed online or at an approved in-person location.

Student Support – Instructor Interactivity

In addition to live interaction during online pre-practicum seminars and supervised practicum training, students have ongoing access to support from Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy and

International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists Certified Instructors through the following methods:

Class Size

For all Institute programs, the maximum number of students per class is as follows:

- Maitland – 12
- Online – 30

The Institute works to keep a one-to-five instructor/supervisor-to-student ratio, where each group of five students has one qualified instructor or supervisor for all practicum seminar hours.

Attendance

Students can achieve the best results only by regularly attending class. The attendance record is part of each student's permanent record, in addition to grades. It is used to determine eligibility for having sufficient classroom hours to take the International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists qualifying examinations for certification. If a student is ill or an emergency arises, the Institute must be notified in advance, if possible, for the student's absence to be excused. Unsatisfactory attendance is grounds for dismissal. Unsatisfactory attendance is defined as: 1. Less than 70% attendance in any given program without prior notification to the teacher, and 2. Being tardy more than four times.

Students must arrange for make-up hours with the Student Services Department for class hours that were missed. Make-up hours must be completed by the end of the current term in which the time and class work was missed. The deadline for make-up hours may be extended by the School Director. If requesting a Leave of Absence, the student must sign and date the leave of absence request and specify a reason for the leave and meet all requirements as specified in the Leave of Absence section. The reason must be identified for the Institution to have a reasonable expectation of the student's return within the time frame of the leave of absence as requested.

Regular and substantive active participation online, as well as during the practicum hours, is required to achieve the minimum 70% attendance standard for graduation. A student attends online courses by participating actively in classes or otherwise engaging in academically related activities. Examples of such activities that demonstrate "regular and substantive interaction" include but are not limited to: contributing to IIH-sponsored online discussions or text chat sessions; submitting assignments or working drafts; working through exercises; taking assessments; student participation in interactive tutorials or computer-assisted instructions, participation in an online study group, initiating contact with a faculty member for academic support, tutoring, or other course-related activities. Students should be sure to meet online deadlines for submitting their work as late work will not receive full credit. Note: Logging into class without active participation as defined above does not constitute participation, and therefore there is no attendance credit.

Tardiness

Punctuality is an important factor in business and education. If a student is more than 15 minutes late for a practicum, it constitutes being tardy.

Leave of Absence

A leave of absence is a temporary break in a student's attendance during which they are considered to be continuously enrolled. The Institute policy is as follows:

1. A leave of absence may be granted for emergency situations such as a serious illness, debilitating injury, death in the immediate family, or other good cause.
2. A student must submit a written request for a leave of absence in advance of the beginning date of the leave of absence unless unforeseen circumstances prevent the student from doing so. If a student does not request a leave of absence within a timeframe consistent with the Institution's consecutive absence policy, they will be withdrawn. Please contact the Student Services office to process an LoA request and to discuss your rationale for the request.
3. The student must sign and date the leave of absence request and specify a reason for the leave. The reason must be identified in order for the institution to have a reasonable expectation of the student's return within the timeframe of the leave of absence as requested.
4. The student must attest to understanding the procedures and implications for returning or failing to return to their course of study.
5. The Institute documents its approval decision relative to the leave of absence request in accordance with its published policy.
6. The institution does not assess the student any additional charges as a result of the leave of absence.
7. The length and frequency of leaves of absence must not impede student progress and must be reasonable within the context of the institution's curriculum.
8. A leave of absence must be limited to a maximum of 180 calendar days in any 12-month period or one-half the published program length, whichever is shorter. Multiple leaves of absence may be permitted provided the total of the leaves does not exceed this limit. An approved leave of absence may be extended for an additional period of time provided that the extension request meets all of the above requirements.
9. If a student requests an LoA for training at a physical location, they may be required to do all future practicum hours online.
10. When a student goes into LoA status, their seat in practicums is released and the student must reschedule into the next ongoing term.

Class/Enrollment Term Change

A student must obtain permission from the Student Services Director in order to change their class schedule if they wish to change the enrollment term in which they are enrolled. Transferring from one class to another may fall within the Leave of Absence policy if the reason for the transfer falls within the approved reasons for Leave of Absence and all other Leave of Absence requirements have been

met. If a transfer between terms does not meet the requirements for Leave of Absence, the student may be subject to the current tuition schedule upon re-entry into the program.

Graduation Requirements

1. The satisfactory completion of all prescribed courses of instruction with a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.0 (C average) or better.
2. Satisfactory completion of IAIH exams for hypnotherapist certification.
3. Satisfaction of all financial obligations to the Institute.
4. Attendance of 70% or greater.

Transcripts

A complete transcript of each student's grades is kept in the student's permanent file. Students must request transcripts in writing. One copy is provided free at graduation (additional copies are available for a cost of \$2.00 each). Transcripts will not be issued unless the student's financial obligations to the Institute are current at the time of the request.

Qualitative Measure

Students must achieve a minimum 1.0 Grade Point Average (hereafter referred to as G.P.A.) at the end of the first 25% of each registered program, 1.5 G.P.A. by 50% of the program, and a 2.0 G.P.A. required in each program for graduation. A student who does not achieve the required G.P.A. will be placed on probation for the next course and is in “Satisfactory Progress”. If at the end of the probation period they have not achieved the required G.P.A., their training will be terminated.

With the completion of 300 hours of total training, a student is required to take the International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists (IAIH) qualifying exam for certification. Satisfactory passing of this exam is required for IAIH certification as a Hypnotherapist and is a requirement for graduation from The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy. If a student does not pass this exam on the first attempt, then that student is allowed one more chance to pass the exam within three months, which begins on the date that the first attempt occurred. Failure to achieve satisfactory marks within this time shall make the student ineligible to take this exam through Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy.

Quantitative Measure

Students are expected to complete their program within the published program length. However, the Institute recognizes that circumstances may require additional time to complete program requirements. A student who has not completed all coursework, practicum hours, examinations, attendance requirements, or other graduation requirements by the anticipated program end date may, with approval from Student Services or the School Director, continue their training through a subsequent cohort or receive an extended period of enrollment.

Students will not be automatically withdrawn solely because the original anticipated program end date has passed. More than one cohort transfer or extension may be permitted when appropriate. Continued enrollment is contingent upon the student maintaining satisfactory academic progress, meeting applicable financial obligations, maintaining reasonable academic participation, and following any completion plan established by the Institute.

The Institute may periodically review a student's progress and establish a revised anticipated completion date. Students who cease participating without an approved extension, fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress, or fail to comply with an approved completion plan may be withdrawn in accordance with Institute policy. An extension of time does not reduce or modify the clock hours, coursework, practicum hours, examinations, or other requirements necessary for graduation.

Increments for Evaluation

To ensure that students are making satisfactory quantitative progress throughout their program of study, the Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy will periodically evaluate each student's completion of required clock hours, coursework, practicum hours, examinations, and other program requirements. Students are expected to progress according to the published program schedule. If a student is unable to complete the program by the anticipated ending date, the student may request additional time or transfer into a subsequent cohort in accordance with the Institute's Extended Program Completion policy. Approval of additional time does not waive or reduce any academic, attendance, practicum, examination, financial, or graduation requirements.

Incomplete Grades

A grade of "I" must be completed by the second week after the exam date, or the grade will be changed to an "F" (G.P.A. will be recalculated accordingly). If not completed, the course must be taken later, which will delay the student's graduation date. The student will be charged for the repeated course(s) at the prevailing tuition rate.

Failure to take appropriate action to complete a course and eliminate a grade of "I" may affect a student's satisfactory progress when the grade is converted to an "F".

If a student demonstrates mitigating circumstances (such as illness, death in the family, etc.), an exception may be made upon appeal to and with the approval of the Institute's Director.

Program Withdrawals

A grade of "W" will not be considered as clock hours successfully completed but will be counted as clock hours attempted. "W" grades are not calculated into the G.P.A.

Program Repetitions

Students may repeat programs in which they earn a grade of "D" or below. Both the original and repeated programs are counted as clock hours attempted. In computing the G.P.A., the clock hours for the program with the higher grade will be counted. The student will be charged the repeated program(s) at the prevailing tuition rate. Students may repeat a program as many times as needed to satisfactorily pass the course if these course repetitions do not affect the student in regard to the Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy.

Non-Credit Remedial Work

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy does not offer any non-credit remedial courses.

Probation

Students not meeting satisfactory academic progress standards at the first checkpoint are automatically placed on a 30-day probation period. During probation, the student is considered to be making satisfactory progress. The student will be notified of the probation and must meet the terms of their probation as outlined in the notification or be terminated.

Progress Reports

Students will be given a copy of their progress report at the end of each program completed. Progress reports are available in the Learning Management System.

Failure to Meet Satisfactory Academic Policy, Appeals, Reinstatement

Failure to Meet Satisfactory Academic Policy

A student failing to meet the Satisfactory Academic Policy standards will be terminated from the Institute and will be notified by certified mail of their failure to meet the standards.

Appeals

Students not meeting the satisfactory academic progress standards are notified by means of a letter from the Student Services Office. Students wishing to appeal the unsatisfactory academic progress determination must do so in writing, within 15 calendar days of the mailing date of the letter sent by the Institute to the Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy at 540 East Horatio Avenue, Suite #200, Maitland, Florida, 32751.

Appeals should be directed to the Academic Progress Committee, which is composed of the School Director, the Student Services Director, and an instructor as chosen by the School's Director. If the student is appealing the unsatisfactory progress determination based on mitigating circumstances, appropriate documentation might include a physician's statement, accident report, or other statements. The Academic Progress Committee will notify the student of their decision within ten days of receiving the student's appeal. The Academic Progress Committee's decision is final.

Reinstatement

Students who have been dismissed for lack of satisfactory progress may apply to be readmitted to the Institution after waiting a period of four weeks. Such students will be enrolled for a probationary period upon re-entry. Students who have not maintained satisfactory progress can reestablish eligibility by successfully completing sufficient clock hours and/or attaining the overall G.P.A. required by the end of the next incremental review period.

Other Policy Considerations

The Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy will include all periods of attendance and will be counted toward the maximum time frame and the qualitative component.

The Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy is applied consistently to all students.

Student Services

Placement Assistance

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy makes every effort to assist students/graduates in finding full- or part-time employment, or in establishing their own private practice. From the day a student enters the school, the student is responsible for the recommendation that the school will submit to a potential employer. A student's academic record, attendance, personal characteristics, attitude, and personal demeanor will all contribute to the Institute's overall evaluation.

How a student thinks and feels, and the quality of work the student produces in school, may to a great degree reflect how the student will perform in their own career.

While the Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy gladly assists students in obtaining suitable employment at no additional charge, it is understood that The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy **does NOT promise or guarantee placement for its students/graduates**. As most Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy graduates will be self-employed, it is the sole responsibility of the student to build and maintain their own private hypnotherapy practice.

Private Tuition Financing

Private student financing is available to qualified students for programs offered by the Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy. Students interested in financing options may contact the Admissions Office at (813) 463-0264.

Students who do not use private student financing may pay tuition in advance or on a per-section or per-program basis. See the **Private Student Financing/Student Loans** section of this catalog for additional information.

Student Advisement

Advisement and guidance begin with the admissions interview and continue throughout the student's course of study. Faculty consultation is possible for academic issues. An appointment may be required with the Student Services Director.

Housing

The Institute does not provide housing for its students.

Lost and Found

Students may check the administrative office for any lost and found items. Any items found on school premises should be turned into the administrative office. These items are kept for 30 days and then disposed of properly.

Personal Property

The Institute cannot be responsible for the student's books, materials, or any other personal belongings. Students are thus responsible for their belongings while in school.

Campus Security

Crimes may be reported to the School Director in person or by calling (813) 463-0264.

Library

The library is accessible to all students. It is open during normal school hours and whenever the doors to the Institute are unlocked. The library resources include books, CDs, videos/DVDs, audio tapes, magazines, and other periodicals. All materials must remain on campus, as lending is currently not available. All food and liquids are prohibited near library materials. Online audio and video resources are also available for students in good standing.

Institute Rules and Regulations

Drugs, Alcohol, Weapons, and Inappropriate Behavior/Conduct – Dismissal Policy

At the discretion of the School Director, a student may be dismissed from school for being intoxicated or appearing to be under the influence of drugs or other intoxicating substances; possession of illegal substances, alcohol, or weapons on school premises; behavior creating a safety hazard to other persons at school; or disrespectful behavior to those at school, as determined by the School Director; or any other reason stated or determined inappropriate action or behavior by a student of The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy, by the School Director.

Grievance Policy

The school is committed to providing a sound and positive educational environment. Understanding that there may be times when students want to express concerns or feel the need to file an official grievance, the school has adopted the following procedure:

1. File the grievance in writing by email where receipt must be acknowledged by the School Director outlining the allegation or nature of the grievance to support@anahateducation.com.
2. Within 10 days of receipt of grievance, a school representative will meet with the student.
3. If the problem is not resolved through discussion, the student will be referred to the school's grievance committee.
4. The school's grievance committee will meet within 21 calendar days of receipt of the grievance and review allegations. The student must bring a copy of the written record of the prior meeting with the school representative.
5. If more information is needed, a letter will be written outlining the additional information requested.
6. If no other information is needed, the grievance committee will act on the allegations and a letter will be sent to the student within 15 calendar days stating the steps taken to resolve the concern or information showing that the allegations were not warranted or based on fact.

Students who feel their grievance is unresolved may refer their grievance to the following address: Commission for Independent Education, Florida Department of Education, 325 W. Gaines Street, Suite 1414, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0400, (850) 245-3200, or toll free (888) 224-6684.

Probation

A student may be placed on probation for any of the following reasons:

1. Not maintaining satisfactory progress
2. Excessive absenteeism
3. Inappropriate behavior

Voluntary Withdrawal/Re-Entry

A student may withdraw from their program of study in person, by telephone, or in writing (including by email). All refunds, if applicable, will be made within 30 days of the Institute's receipt of the

student's notice to withdraw. It is understood that a student may request re-entry at a later date, as per the section Class/Enrollment Term Change.

Health and Safety

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy complies with requirements and regulations of state and local building codes, the Board of Health, and the fire department.

Adverse Weather and Emergency Closing

At times, emergencies such as severe weather, fire, power failures, or hurricanes can disrupt school operations. In extreme cases, these circumstances may require the closing of the school.

When the decision to close the Institute is made after the workday has begun, employees will receive official notification from the School Director and students will be informed appropriately.

Emergency Evacuation Plan

In case of fire or any other disaster, please listen to the School Director or the school officials in charge for instructions. All instructors are in charge of their class. Follow the evacuation plan to evacuate the building immediately in an organized and orderly manner. Do not take time to gather books or other belongings. The instructor of each class is the evacuation coordinator and shall ensure that their class remains calm. The evacuation coordinator for the main office is the school official in charge.

In the event of fire, do not try to extinguish the fire. The evacuation coordinator or other school official will handle contacting the appropriate fire and rescue departments.

In case of a security problem, listen to the School Director or other school officials for security directions. In all instances, you must remain calm.

The security person will coordinate with the Police Department the proper actions necessary to assure student and school personnel safety.

Evacuation Plan

There are exits at the front of The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy. In the event of an emergency, calmly head to the nearest exit.

Incidents/Accidents

In case of an incident or accident, please inform the School Director or the Instructor of your program so the appropriate forms and measures can be taken. In case of an emergency during school hours, the school will take appropriate action to obtain medical assistance.

Dress Code

The Institute expects students to come to school dressed in a manner that is appropriate for the profession in which they are training. Casual dress is acceptable yet should not be a distraction to one's fellow students.

Safety in Private Spaces

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy respects the dignity and identity of all individuals. We recognize that not everyone identifies exclusively as male or female and affirm the rights of individuals to express their gender identity in a manner that is authentic to them, including those who identify as nonbinary or transgender. However, as per Florida Law, we are obligated to provide a policy on “Safe Spaces” and do so here, with tremendous respect to every person’s right to be themselves and to feel safe within their own skin. We are an inclusive organization that honors who you are and one that also honors the respective laws of the State in which we conduct business.

As per The Safety in Private Spaces Act (FL SB1674, 553.865 - Private spaces.), females and males are provided restrooms for their exclusive use, respective to their sex, in order to maintain public safety, decency, decorum, and privacy. Students, faculty, and administrative personnel are required to use the restroom that corresponds to their biological sex at birth.

As per subsection (6) of 553.865, a person may only enter a restroom designated for the opposite sex under the following circumstances:

- (a) To accompany a person of the opposite sex for the purpose of assisting or chaperoning a child under the age of 12, an elderly person as defined in s. 825.101, or a person with a disability as defined in s. 760.22 or a developmental disability as defined in s. 393.063;
- (b) For law enforcement or governmental regulatory purposes;
- (c) For the purpose of rendering emergency medical assistance or to intervene in any other emergency situation where the health or safety of another person is at risk;
- (d) For custodial, maintenance, or inspection purposes, provided that the restroom or changing facility is not in use; or
- (e) If the appropriate designated restroom or changing facility is out of order or under repair and the restroom or changing facility designated for the opposite sex contains no person of the opposite sex.

Any student who wilfully enters, for a purpose other than those listed in subsection (6), a restroom designated for the opposite sex on the premises of the educational institution and refuses to depart when asked to do so by any administrative personnel, faculty member, security personnel, or law enforcement personnel will be considered to be demonstrating “inappropriate behavior” and placed on probation as per the Probation policy in this catalog. A second offense may result in dismissal at the discretion of the School Director.

Any faculty or administrative personnel who wilfully enters, for a purpose other than those listed in subsection (6), a restroom designated for the opposite sex on the premises of the educational institution and refuses to depart when asked to do so by any administrative personnel, faculty member, security personnel, or law enforcement personnel will be subject to the disciplinary procedures listed in the Employee Handbook.

Smoking and Beverages

Smoking is prohibited everywhere within the building and within 50 feet of building entrances. Food and beverages are not permitted in the classroom or offices. Only sealable bottles of water are allowed in the classroom.

Student Rights

The following information is made available to all current students and to any prospective student upon request.

1. The cost of attending the Institute, including: (I) tuition and fees, (II) books and supplies, (III) any additional cost of the program in which the student is enrolled or expresses a specific interest.
2. A copy of the refund policy.
3. The academic program of the Institution including: (I) educational and training programs, (II) the instructional laboratory and other facilities which relate to the academic program, and (III) faculty and other instructional personnel.
4. The methods by which, and locations in which students and prospective students may obtain the information concerning their rights.
5. The name of the associations, agencies, and/or governmental bodies which license the Institute and its programs, and the procedures under which any current or prospective student may obtain or review upon request a copy of the documents describing the Institute's licensing.

Student Responsibilities

1. Promptly providing any information requested by the Institute.
2. Keeping the Institute informed of any change in name, address, marital status, financial situation, or change in their student status.
3. Notifying the Institute if they need to withdraw from the school or wish to request a leave of absence.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Should a student's enrollment be terminated or cancelled for any reason, all refunds will be made according to the following refund schedule:

1. Cancellation can be made in person, by electronic mail, by Certified Mail, or by termination.
2. All monies will be refunded if the school does not accept the applicant or if the student cancels within three (3) business days after signing the enrollment agreement and making initial payment.
3. Cancellation after the third (3rd) business day, but before the first class, results in a refund of all monies paid, with the exception of the registration fee (not to exceed \$150.00).
4. Cancellation after attendance has begun, through 40% completion of the program, will result in a Pro Rata refund computed on the number of hours completed to the total program hours.
5. Cancellation after completing 40% of the program will result in no refund.
6. Termination Date: In calculating the refund due to a student, the last date of actual attendance, which is determined through the last time the student accessed the school's online distance learning system, is used in the calculation unless earlier written notice is received.
7. Refunds will be made within 30 days of termination of students' enrollment or receipt of Cancellation Notice from student.

Withdraw Policy

The Institute recognizes conditions may arise which can cause changes in plans of students; and that under such circumstances, provisions for cancellation should be made. **If cancellation is effected (under this clause), the student reserves the right to apply for reinstatement within one year of the date of enrollment.** Refunds shall be made within thirty days from the date of withdrawal.

Students leaving the Institute and having an outstanding balance will be required to pay the amount in full within thirty days. Delinquent accounts can and will be turned over to collections. Any costs related to the collection of the amount owed will be charged to the student's account.

1. Notification in writing stating outstanding balance
2. Follow-up phone call one week after written notification
3. Second written notification 30 days after first written notification
4. Follow-up phone call one week after second written notification

8. Final courtesy follow-up call
9. If satisfactory payment arrangements are not made, the student's balance will be reported to the credit bureaus.

After 30 days of delinquency on a TFC financing account, the late payment may be reported to the credit bureaus and may adversely affect the student’s credit. After 120 days of delinquency, the account may be referred to collections and reported as being in default. Students experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to contact the school as soon as possible to discuss available options before delinquency results in negative credit reporting.	

Financial Probation

Students who fall behind more than 30 days on payments will receive notice as outlined in the school's catalog. In the event that a student is delinquent with tuition for more than 60 days, then the Institute reserves the right to suspend access to all online training and to all in-house practicum hours until the balance of tuition monies owed from the time of enrollment until the time the student requests full access again is paid in full. The Institute reserves the right to make exceptions on a case-by-case basis.

Students who are on financial probation may need to pay for additional mentoring hours to catch up with their class or they may need to take a leave of absence and move to the next class.

TFC Student Financing

The Institute takes late or delinquent tuition payments seriously. Students whose accounts are past due may have access to tests, quizzes, and practicum seminars suspended until the account is brought current.

Diplomas may be awarded only when a student is in good standing with the Institute with respect to tuition, attendance, and academic requirements, and has established and maintained a good-faith payment history for at least six consecutive months. Any late payment may interrupt that payment history and require the six-month period to begin again.

Accounts that remain in default may be referred to collections and may be reported to credit bureaus, which could adversely affect the student's credit. The Institute also reserves the right to pursue any remedies available under applicable law.

Policy for Course or Program Cancellation

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy reserves the right to cancel a course or program if the minimum enrollment of ten students is not met. Students enrolled in a cancelled course or program will be notified promptly and may choose to transfer their enrollment to the next available start date or receive a refund in accordance with the Institute's Refund Policy.

In the event of an unforeseen cancellation or closure that prevents the Institute from providing the contracted training, applicable tuition refunds will be issued within 30 days in accordance with the Institute's Refund Policy and applicable law.

If a particular in-person Practicum Seminar location does not meet the minimum enrollment requirement, students will be offered the opportunity to attend the Practicum Seminar at another approved location or online. Cancellation of an individual Practicum Seminar location does not constitute cancellation of the student's course or program when another approved practicum option is available.

Programs and Courses

Course Numbering System

The following is an explanation of the course numbering system for programs offered at The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy. The course numbers are made up of numbers and letters that symbolize the name of the program and the sequence of the courses.

Successful completion of the Hypnotherapist program is a prerequisite for enrollment in the Clinical Hypnotherapist and Transpersonal Hypnotherapist programs. Students who have completed the Hypnotherapist program may choose to continue into the Clinical Hypnotherapist program, the Transpersonal Hypnotherapist program, or both.

Program – Hypnotherapist – 300 Hours Total

HT – Hypnotherapist – 300 Hours

Program – Clinical Hypnotherapist – 400 Hours Total (Including program Hypnotherapist)

CH – Clinical Hypnotherapist – 100 Hours

Program – Transpersonal Hypnotherapist – 500 Hours Total (Including programs Hypnotherapist and Clinical Hypnotherapist)

TP – Transpersonal Hypnotherapist – 100 Hours

IAIH Standards for Certification



IAIH Certified Hypnotherapist

Has completed at least three hundred (300) hours of instruction from an IAIH approved hypnotherapy school that is licensed by their state's Department of Education. The Hypnotherapist must also pass the IAIH written and practical skills exam and all online exams, and meet all attendance requirements. Exceptions are considered on a non-discriminatory basis and may be granted by the Qualifying Board. (The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy program Hypnotherapist - HT).

IAIH Certified Clinical Hypnotherapist

Has completed at least four hundred (400) hours of instruction from an IAIH approved hypnotherapy school that is licensed by their state's Department of Education. The Hypnotherapist must also pass

the IAIH written and practical skills exam and all online exams, and meet all attendance requirements. Exceptions are considered on a non-discriminatory basis and may be granted by the Qualifying Board (The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy programs Clinical Hypnotherapist including HT and CH).

IAIH Certified Transpersonal Hypnotherapist

Has completed at least five hundred (500) hours of instruction from an IAIH approved hypnotherapy school that is licensed by their state's Department of Education. The Hypnotherapist must also pass the IAIH written and practical skills exam and all online exams, and meet all attendance requirements. Exceptions are considered on a non-discriminatory basis and may be granted by the Qualifying Board. (The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy programs Clinical Hypnotherapist and Transpersonal Hypnotherapist including HT, CH, and TP).

Preparation for Certification

The Institute prepares students for IAIH certification by providing the necessary coursework to meet IAIH standards, while preparing students thoroughly to take the IAIH qualifying exam. We do this through our interactive distance learning training videos, training manuals, exam study guides, practicum seminar study guides, online live classes, and practicum seminar hours. Personal mentoring is also available for students requiring extra assistance. Test vouchers for authorized testing centers are not required as all exams are done online or in our Maitland location. There is no additional fee for taking exams through the Institute.

Program of Study - Hypnotherapist

Program Objective

To study and learn the concepts that relate to the field of Hypnotism. To achieve fundamental skills in the use of hypnotic induction and the effective delivery of suggestions. To educate students about the safe and effective use of hypnosis and its legal and ethical practice. To study and learn the concepts that relate to more advanced hypnotism practices which utilize the hypnotic state to promote positive change, while preparing the student to enter into a professional hypnotherapy practice with the required tools for successful business operations. To study and learn the concepts that relate to the field of regressive hypnotherapy, including the use of the Institute's 16-step Regression Therapy Protocol, Basic Transactional Analysis, Modified Gestalt Dialogues, and Forgiveness and Compassion Formulas. To prepare the student to successfully complete a 16-step Regression Therapy Protocol.

Program Description

A comprehensive 300 clock hour series of courses to teach the theory and practice of the fundamentals of hypnotism, advanced hypnotism, and regression hypnotherapy training.

Length of Time: Approximately 21 instructional weeks; calendar duration may be longer due to scheduled holidays and breaks

Graduation Requirements: Must have a minimum of 2.0 G.P.A. and must complete the program within the acceptable time frame.

This program consists of three sections, each with approximately seven weeks of training, each containing approximately 15 clock hours of class weekly, and three days of in-house or online practicum training, amounting to 30 clock hours per section. No entrance exam is required.

In order to complete this program, the student is required to take and pass the IAIH's clinical qualifying examination for certification as a hypnotherapist and is therefore prepared accordingly.

Upon completion of this program, the Institute will award a diploma entitled: Hypnotherapist.

HT101 15 CLOCK HOURS	Introduction Introduces students to the nature of hypnosis, theories of hypnosis, the legal practice of hypnosis and the history of hypnosis. Myths and misconceptions concerning the hypnotic state are dispelled and a solid foundation for the study of hypnotism is established.
HT102 6 CLOCK HOURS	Building Rapport Students are introduced to the importance of rapport between the hypnotist and the client, and various skills are learned and practiced ensuring this is well understood.
HT103 3 CLOCK HOURS	Depth of Hypnotic State Prepares students for understanding the various levels of hypnosis and their relationship to suggestibility. Various scales are discussed, and a thorough understanding of the full range of hypnotic phenomena is explained.

HT110 2 CLOCK HOURS	Basic Neuro-Linguistic Programming Prepares the student in the basic practice of Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) in establishing and working with anchors, hypnotic language patterns, and other NLP techniques related to the practice of hypnosis. Also introduces the student to the basic presuppositions of NLP, its origins, and its practice within and outside of the fields of hypnosis.
HT111 4 CLOCK HOURS	Smoking Cessation Protocol Prepares the student for an entire hypnosis protocol in working with a client to stop smoking using hypnosis and NLP. HT201 10 CLOCK HOURS	Practice Management To prepare the student upon successful graduation to enter the field of professional hypnotherapy with the skills to operate a successful business. This includes note taking, scheduling appointments, file management, referrals, office and equipment set-up, accounting principles, and other components of operating a business and hypnotherapy practice.
HT202 10 CLOCK HOURS	Advertising and Marketing Strategies To prepare the student upon successful graduation to have the necessary skills to promote a professional hypnotherapy practice and to ensure a healthy client base. This class focuses on creative tools to build one’s business as well as the legal and ethical parameters of promoting oneself as a hypnotherapist.

HT203 7 CLOCK HOURS	Transforming Subconscious Beliefs This course empowers the student with skills for uncovering the underlying belief systems which generate negative emotions, and which motivate unwanted behaviors. Techniques are taught to uncover these beliefs as well as to change them into positive and constructive models from which to live one's life.
HT204 7 CLOCK HOURS	Focusing and Core Transformation This course covers the fundamental practice of the Focusing method of Dr. Eugene Gendlin and the Core Transformation method of Connie Rae Andreas as a means of uncovering and transforming the cause of one's problems. HT301 8 CLOCK HOURS	Introduction to Regression Introduces the concept of using the hypnotic state to access memories usually related to childhood. Discusses the indications and contraindications for its use as well as the many types of regression that can be used.
HT302 9 CLOCK HOURS	Pre-Hypnosis Interview Prepares the student to work with clients in a regressive hypnotherapy model through encouraging a more thorough intake process than the fundamentals program. Includes more elaborate information gathering techniques as well as rapport building skills.
HT303 6 CLOCK HOURS	Uncovering Techniques Prepares the student to discover the underlying emotions associated with a client's problems and works to use these emotions as a bridge back to the cause of the problems. Involves a more expanded view of intake, focusing, and uncovering core belief systems.
HT304 8 CLOCK HOURS	Age Regression A course of study detailing the uses of regression, the means of regression, and the processing of the information uncovered. The course prepares the student to work with more advanced techniques by laying the foundation for the confident use of regressive methods.
HT305 6 CLOCK HOURS	Gestalt Dialogues Prepares the student to facilitate positive change through a modified Gestalt process of dialoguing with key figures involved in a regression. Includes training in cathartic emotional release, and advanced methods for healing and resolving sensitizing events.
HT306 6 CLOCK HOURS	Basic Transactional Analysis An introduction to working with the various ego-states of parent, adult, and child as a means of resolving conflicts held deep within the subconscious mind.
HT307 3 CLOCK HOURS	Forgiveness and Compassion Formulas Regression therapy requires that the memories that are brought to consciousness are thoroughly resolved, therefore very practical and simple formulas are taught to bring the client to a place of forgiveness and compassion for themselves and others.

HT308 4 CLOCK HOURS	Integrating Core Transformation The Core Transformation process, as taught in Advanced Hypnotism, is now integrated into the regression therapy protocol to lead a client into the core state where very deep experiences of love, joy, and personal wholeness are experienced.
HT309 6 CLOCK HOURS	Regression Protocol Integration Hypnotherapist training involves the comprehension and application of a 16-step regression therapy protocol that includes many components. It is here that these components are integrated into an entire session that leads to the culmination of the first 300 hours of training.
HT310 4 CLOCK HOURS	Hypnoanalysis Students explore some of the pioneering work of Mr. Dave Elman, who founded many of the techniques of hypnotic induction and the processing of memories that are still used to this day. While his methods are now highly modified, this course offers respect for the work of a great man and helps students to understand how our profession has evolved over the years.
HT311 3 CLOCK HOURS	Analytical Hypnotherapy Prepares the student to work with the Analytical techniques as found in E.A. Barnett's book Analytical Hypnotherapy. Includes the use of regression and the Transactional Analysis model.
HT312 3 CLOCK HOURS	Amnesia Capacity Estimation Measuring depth of hypnosis can be done through many methods. The work of E.A. Barnett utilized a style of Amnesia Capacity Estimation to determine depth of trance by levels of amnesia that can be produced. This has proven to be a very valuable model when levels of hypnosis are important in one's work.
HT313 2 CLOCK HOURS	Reinventing Yourself A course dedicated to the work of Mr. Dick Sutphen who offered what are known as the Critical 15. These are the 15 things that people do that cause their own suffering. The cause of this suffering is addressed and the action to overcome it is taught.
HT314 2 CLOCK HOURS	Hypnotic Dreamwork This course teaches students how to process dreams using the hypnotic state. Based upon the work of Fritz Perls, dream characters unfold into symbolic messages of what the subconscious mind is truly working to tell us in our dreams.

Hypnotherapist Practicum Seminar

Practical (hands-on or online) hours are interspersed throughout this program to encourage students to practice each and every technique that they have been taught on their fellow students. This allows students to not only practice what they are learning, but also to experience it for themselves.

Program of Study – Clinical Hypnotherapist

Program Objective

To study the concepts related to the use of hypnosis in therapeutic and medical settings and to establish clear guidelines for assessing scope of practice. Students are introduced to practical methods for using hypnosis in coordination with appropriately licensed health care professionals, including those in medicine, chiropractic, dentistry, and childbirth. Emphasis is placed on helping students recognize the limits of their training, identify situations that require referral to or collaboration with licensed professionals, and understand when supervision, direction, prescription, or other legal requirements may apply.

Program Description

A comprehensive 100 clock hour program centered upon the therapeutic and medical aspects of hypnosis. Accelerated healing methods, pain management, and working with medical professionals are the primary emphasis of this program. Clinical training also teaches the theory and practice of more advanced regression methods with a strong emphasis on practical hours to ensure successful application of all previously learned methods.

Length of Time: 7 weeks

Graduation Requirements: Must have a minimum of 2.0 G.P.A. and must complete the program within the acceptable time frame.

This program consists of approximately seven weeks of training each containing approximately 15 clock hours of class weekly, and three days of supervised practicum training, completed online or at an approved in-person location, amounting to 30 clock hours. Completion of the Hypnotherapist program is required to attend this program.

Upon completion of this program, the Institute will award a diploma entitled: Clinical Hypnotherapist.

CH401 6 CLOCK HOURS	Natal Regression Instructs the student in the model of Natal Regression and the indications and contraindications. Lays the foundation for regression methods to access early memories and the means of processing them thoroughly.
CH402 3 CLOCK HOURS	Transactional Analysis Reviews the basics of Transactional Analysis and deepens the student's understanding of working with the three major ego-states. Explores the deeper dynamics of these three states and explains further methods of integration.
CH403 5 CLOCK HOURS	Neuroscience and Research Introduces students to the current research in therapeutic hypnosis and the most up-to-date neuroscience applications. This course helps students to understand the brain/mind/body connection and the science behind the clinical research. Practical applications are a primary consideration to ensure that pragmatic tools can be integrated into one's Clinical Hypnotherapy practice.
CH404 5 CLOCK HOURS	Integrating Modalities This course helps students integrate previously learned concepts and techniques into comprehensive, individualized protocols. Students learn to combine modalities from earlier coursework to develop personalized strategies that support meaningful and lasting positive change.
CH405 12 CLOCK HOURS	Breathwork Prepares the student to facilitate Breathwork sessions where a client is led in the primary method of Rebirthing to uncover suppressed emotions and resolve deep-seated memories. Works to understand the nature of emotional release and prepares the student to provide a safe space for clients to truly open and heal.

CH406 8 CLOCK HOURS	Medical Hypnotherapy Helps the student to have a deeper appreciation of the state statutes for the practice of hypnosis for medical conditions in coordination with “licensed practitioners of the healing arts.” Teaches scope of practice assessment and the importance of integrative and preventative health care, especially regarding the model of complementary medicine.
CH407 5 CLOCK HOURS	Anatomy and Physiology An introduction to the human body and its many systems, as well as theories on the mind/body connection and how the brain can control the body’s sensations and healing mechanisms.
CH408 7 CLOCK HOURS	Hypnosis in Pain Management An introduction to the practice of using hypnosis in supporting pain-management goals within the practitioner’s lawful scope of practice. CH410 1 CLOCK HOUR	Hypnosis in Childbirth Prepares students to support pregnant clients in promoting relaxation, reducing stress and fear, and increasing comfort during pregnancy and childbirth. Techniques may include relaxation, stress reduction, pain-management support, and methods intended to strengthen the mother-child bond and foster a more positive emotional experience.
CH411 2 CLOCK HOURS	Hypnosis in Dentistry Prepares the hypnotist to work one-on-one with a dentist in helping patients to relax, eliminate fear, and even undergo dental procedures in coordination with the treating dentist and within applicable law.
CH412 4 CLOCK HOURS	Hypnosis in Medical Settings Provides students practical ways to integrate their hypnotherapy practice into medical and hospital settings. Instructs the student in the use of hypnosis for medical emergencies to teach first responders enhanced communication skills with those to whom they attend.

CH413 10 CLOCK HOURS	Healing with Hypnosis A thorough exploration of the healing power of the mind as found within many traditions including Mesmerism, Hypnotism, Psychoneurophysiology, New Thought Movements, Faith Healing, the Placebo Effect, as well as in-depth reviews of the books The Sutras on Healing and Enlightenment and A Course in Miracles.
CH414 30 CLOCK HOURS	Clinical Practicum Seminar Practical (hands-on or online) hours are interspersed throughout this program to encourage students to practice each and every technique that they have been taught on their fellow students. This allows students to not only practice what they are learning, but also to experience it for themselves.

Program of Study – Transpersonal Hypnotherapist

Program Objective

To study and learn the concepts that relate to theories of reincarnation and karma, and how to successfully use the hypnotic state to access past-life memories. To provide the student with a metaphysical/transpersonal model of a human being to create hypnotherapists who can offer a spiritual component to their work.

Program Description

A comprehensive 100 clock hour program to teach the theory and practice of past-life regression therapy and other more esoteric concepts often associated with hypnotherapy practice.

Length of Time: 7 weeks

Graduation Requirements: Must have a minimum of 2.0 G.P.A. and must complete the program within the acceptable time frame.

This program consists of approximately seven weeks of training each containing approximately 15 clock hours of class weekly, and three days of supervised practicum training, completed online or at an approved in-person location, amounting to 30 clock hours. Completion of the Hypnotherapist program is required to attend this program. Completion of the Clinical Hypnotherapist program is not required to attend this program.

Upon completion of this program, the Institute will award a diploma entitled Transpersonal Hypnotherapist.

Completing this program, including Hypnotherapist and Clinical Hypnotherapist training concludes the 500-hour training through the Institute and awards upon the student all relevant Institute Diplomas and qualifies them for IAIH Certification.

TP601 8 CLOCK HOURS	Macro- and Microcosmology An in-depth look into a metaphysical model of the universe and its genesis, as well as the human being's place within this macrocosmic order. This course begins the Transpersonal work of the Institute's training, where a human being is seen as having a spiritual side that becomes exceptionally empowering in the healing process.
TP602 10 CLOCK HOURS	Theories of Reincarnation and Karma Models of multiple lifetimes are covered. Along with the traditional models of reincarnation, we also explore theories of transmigration and the oversoul theory, while looking at how unresolved karma affects current life situations.
TP603 10 CLOCK HOURS	Eastern Philosophy and Psychology A detailed look into the Yoga Sutras of Patanjali and an Eastern model of the psyche and the Spirit. This course explores the causes of human suffering and a means for eliminating this suffering through the practice of Samadhi meditation.
TP604 16 CLOCK HOURS	Past-Life Regression Therapy Prepares the student to facilitate a past-life regression session including pre-talk and education, trance induction and deepening to access past-life memories, processing past-life information, working with the inter-life space, working with guides/higher wisdom, processing unresolved karma, and integrating new understandings into the present life situation.
TP605 8 CLOCK HOURS	Life-Between-Life Regression A deeper look into the use of hypnosis to explore the time known as "life-between-life," where the Transpersonal Hypnotherapist facilitates a thorough review of the events that occur after a past-life and before the next incarnation.
TP606 8 CLOCK HOURS	Special Instances of Altered State Work Based largely upon the work of Winifred Blake Lucas, PhD, and Dr. Edith Fiore, we explore the nature of entity attachment and how such energies affect clients. This course explores ancient and modern theories of possession and the means for releasement. The use of hypnosis for uncovering memories of alien abduction and other esoteric concepts are also covered.

TP607 4 CLOCK HOURS	Out-of-Body Experiences and Remote Viewing This course helps the student to understand and experience a deeper spiritual component of their being. As clients will have questions in this regard, the student is empowered with this knowledge, as well as the methods of hypnosis used to facilitate experiences outside of the physical body, including the concept of remote viewing to use the altered state to have direct and verifiable experiences of what modern physicists call a non-local universe.

Additional Expenses

Optional Expenses

1. The initial fee for registration and certification through the International Association of Interpersonal Hypnotherapists is \$75.00, paid annually, with printed certificates costing \$10 each.
2. The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy has a network of graduates trained to offer optional additional mentoring or tutoring hours to students. These services generally cost \$75 per hour and are payable to the mentors directly. Contact our Student Services Department for more information.
3. Each Clinical Externship Location typically has a graduation dinner at the end of the Transpersonal Hypnotherapy in-house practicum seminar hours. This optional dinner is open to any graduate and their friends and family. 7. **Printed Manuals and Practicum Guides**

Being a predominantly online training, we do not provide printed training manuals or practicum guides as part of your tuition. To Apply

To reserve a seat in the class, students must submit a minimum payment of \$300, plus any additional tuition payment and applicable tax. Payment Periods

Appendix II – United States Hypnosis Law

Educational Legal Information for Students and Graduates

Core Legal Principles

Education and certification are not state licensure. IIH diplomas and IAIH certification document education and private professional certification. They do not create authority to perform acts reserved by law to licensed professions.

Therapeutic and nontherapeutic uses must be distinguished. General relaxation, motivation, performance, confidence, and habit-change work may be treated differently from hypnosis used to diagnose, treat, or claim to treat a medical, dental, psychological, psychiatric, substance-use, or other regulated health condition.

A referral is not a universal legal safe harbor. Referral, prescription, direction, supervision, or professional responsibility has legal significance only where the applicable law recognizes that pathway and its requirements are actually met.

Titles and advertising matter. The title “Hypnotherapist” is an educational and professional credentialing title used by IIH and IAIH, but it is not a state health-care license. State law may separately restrict professional titles or advertising that implies licensure.

Remote practice can involve more than one jurisdiction. For online services, practitioners should identify where they are located and where the client is physically located for the session, review the laws that may apply in both jurisdictions, and use the more restrictive applicable standard when the rules differ or are uncertain until competent legal guidance is obtained.

Absence of a hypnosis-specific statute does not mean unrestricted practice. A state may regulate the same activity through its medicine, psychology, counseling, psychotherapy, social-work, dentistry, consumer-protection, or other professional-practice laws.

Understanding the Scope Continuum

Generally nontherapeutic work includes ordinary self-improvement goals such as relaxation, confidence, public speaking, study skills, sports or performance enhancement, motivation, and habit-focused work when the practitioner is not treating a diagnosed medical or mental-health condition. Gray-area topics can include stress, sleep, anxious feelings, situational sadness, grief, fears, pain coping, trauma-related language, emotional healing, and compulsive habits because the same words may describe either ordinary life concerns or symptoms of a regulated condition. Clearly therapeutic or regulated-health territory includes treatment of diagnosed mental disorders and treatment of disease, injury, chronic pain, anesthesia, medical symptoms, or psychological aspects of physical illness. Terminology alone does not determine scope; the actual purpose, claims, client condition, and applicable law control.

Understanding the Color-Coded Guidance

The color designations used in the state summaries are an educational risk-management tool developed by the Institute to help readers quickly understand the general level of legal or scope-of-practice caution indicated by the Institute's current research. The colors are not classifications established by any state government, licensing board, or regulatory agency, and they do not constitute legal advice or a determination that a particular practice is lawful or unlawful.

Color	Meaning
GREEN	A relatively clear statutory, regulatory, registration, or other recognized pathway for hypnosis or certain hypnosis services appears to exist. Practitioners must still comply with all applicable limitations and requirements.
YELLOW	Hypnosis may be permissible in a nontherapeutic or otherwise limited context, but important legal questions, professional-practice restrictions, title restrictions, or areas requiring additional verification remain.
ORANGE	There is substantial potential overlap with a licensed profession or another significant legal restriction. Unlicensed practitioners should exercise heightened caution and generally remain within clearly lawful nontherapeutic or expressly exempt activities.
RED	The Institute's research indicates a substantial restriction on the relevant therapeutic activity or a strong likelihood that the activity falls within a licensed profession. Practitioners should not provide the regulated service without the required professional license or another clearly established legal authorization.
COMBINED COLORS	Designations such as GREEN/YELLOW, YELLOW/ORANGE, or ORANGE/RED indicate that a jurisdiction does not fit neatly within one category or that the level of restriction depends on the particular activity. Alabama

Practical scope guidance: Assume substantial regulated-profession overlap for therapeutic work. Keep any unlicensed services within a clearly lawful nontherapeutic/exempt pathway and avoid diagnosis, treatment claims, and protected titles.

Title / referral / online considerations: No express standalone restriction on “Hypnotherapist” is confirmed in the current research for this entry. This is not an affirmative finding that the title is lawful in every context. BPC § 2908 expressly recognizes persons using hypnotic techniques by referral from persons licensed to practice medicine, dentistry, or psychology, and separately recognizes avocational/vocational self-improvement that does not offer therapy for emotional or mental disorders. Practitioners should independently confirm whether § 2908 and any unlicensed-healing-arts disclosure statutes apply to a practitioner outside California serving a California client.

Colorado

An unlicensed practitioner should not assume that a disclosure statement or referral permits psychotherapy or another activity reserved to a licensed profession.

Connecticut

The statute defines “hypnotist” and “hypnosis,” establishes the registry and complaint process, and authorizes a civil penalty for practicing hypnosis without first registering. Current application, renewal, fee, and background-check details must be verified directly with DCP before publication.

Practical scope guidance: A nontherapeutic or registration-based pathway appears to exist, but comply strictly with registration, disclosure, advertising, recordkeeping, and scope limits. Do not extend the pathway into medical or mental-health treatment unless expressly authorized.

However, § 485.002 and § 485.003(4) use “direction, supervision, or prescription,” while § 485.003(3) and § 485.004 use the more demanding conjunctive formulation “supervision, direction, prescription, and responsibility.” Treat this guiding difference as a legal question for counsel rather than reducing the rule to “obtain a referral.” No hypnosis-specific interstate rule was identified in Chapter 485. Practitioners should independently advise how Chapter 485 applies when either practitioner or client is physically outside Florida.

Practical scope guidance: Use a conservative nontherapeutic scope pending current primary-law verification. Do not rely on the absence of a hypnosis-specific statute as permission to diagnose or treat regulated conditions.

This is not an affirmative finding that the title is lawful in every context. Practitioners should independently verify title-protection statutes, board rules, and whether the title could imply a regulated health-profession license based on the services advertised. No general referral/prescription/supervision safe harbor has been confirmed for this jurisdiction in the current research. A referral should be treated as clinically useful coordination only unless current law expressly gives it legal significance. No hypnosis-specific interstate rule is confirmed in this entry. Primary authority / starting source: Current state professional-practice, title-protection, consumer-protection, and health-occupation statutes require primary-source independent verification.

Wisconsin

Current research summary (ORANGE; additional verification recommended): Wisconsin defines the practice of psychology, when done for a fee, to include hypnosis, counseling, consultation, psychoanalysis, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior therapy, and applied behavior analysis. Current exemptions and the boundary for nontherapeutic hypnosis should be independently verified.

Practical scope guidance: Assume substantial regulated-profession overlap for therapeutic work. Keep any unlicensed services within a clearly lawful nontherapeutic/exempt pathway and avoid diagnosis, treatment claims, and protected titles.

Wyoming

Current research summary (ORANGE; additional verification recommended): Wyoming includes hypnosis within the statutory practice of psychology. Current exemptions, licensing requirements, and the implications for nontherapeutic hypnosis should be independently verified from the present Wyoming statutes and Board rules.

Practical scope guidance: Assume substantial regulated-profession overlap for therapeutic work. Keep any unlicensed services within a clearly lawful nontherapeutic/exempt pathway and avoid diagnosis, treatment claims, and protected titles.

Practitioner Responsibility

Before beginning practice or expanding into a new service area, students and graduates should identify the exact service they intend to provide, the claims they intend to make, the occupational title they intend to use, and the jurisdiction or jurisdictions involved. They should then verify current law from primary governmental sources. When the proposed work involves a diagnosed medical or mental-health condition, a protected professional title, an unclear referral or supervision arrangement, or conflicting interstate requirements, independent legal or regulatory guidance is recommended before proceeding.

A more detailed educational resource may be maintained separately by IAIH/IIH. Any separate guide, website summary, or training material should likewise be treated as informational rather than as individualized legal advice.

Appendix III – Copyright Policy

Copyright Policy

The Institute of Interpersonal Hypnotherapy strictly prohibits the illegal copying of copyrighted texts, publications, documents, and computer software or peer-to-peer file sharing.

Instructors may only copy portions of texts for single use as handouts to illustrate lesson plans, as permitted by federal copyright law. Students may not illegally copy texts or software for distribution, use, or sale.

If this policy is violated, the person responsible will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination or dismissal.

Copyright infringement is the act of exercising, without permission or legal authority, one or more of the exclusive rights granted to the copyright owner under section 106 of the Copyright Act (Title 17 of the United States Code). These rights include the right to reproduce or distribute a copyrighted work.

In the file-sharing context, downloading or uploading substantial parts of a copyrighted work without authority constitutes an infringement.

Penalties for copyright infringement include civil and criminal penalties.

In general, anyone found liable for civil copyright infringement may be ordered to pay either actual damages or “statutory” damages affixed at not less than \$750 and not more than \$30,000 per work infringed. For “willful” infringement, a court may award up to \$150,000 per work infringed. A court can, in its discretion, also assess costs and attorneys’ fees.
